From the Vicarage

It seems like a long time ago now that I moved into the area. It has been great to settle in and I'm very grateful that everyone has made me feel so welcome. Highlights over the past few months include seeing a regular visitor in the vicarage garden (a red squirrel!), seeing the abundant energy of all the children we work with in the benefice, and joining Penrith Town Band. That's without forgetting the privilege it is to join in with you all as we search to deepen our relationship with God.

It's amazing though that now thoughts are turning to the summer holidays. In the life of the church, the summer months are often quieter as people will be spending time away. It might also be that in the summer we look at undertaking those tasks that we have otherwise put off. But it is important I think to make the most of our holiday time. To spend some time existing as a human "being" as opposed to a human "doing". If you're a Christian, then we are called to do this to re-energise our relationship with God.

In Mark 6:30-32, the apostles are all excited to report back to Jesus all that they had done on their mission trip. It seems to be that instead of being too concerned with all that the apostles have done, Jesus instead invites them to "come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest awhile". Perhaps they were disappointed at his lack of acknowledgement at all the good things they had done. Instead, it seems to be that Jesus thinks it more important in that moment for them to come away and spend time with God.

Time and again in the gospels, Jesus gives the example of going away to a quiet place to spend time in prayer and to refresh. Here he also invites his followers to observe the same pattern.

So over the summer, let us find some time to put aside our achievements and the many things that we have done and just spend some time resting. That might include resting with family and friends, or if you are a Christian, taking some time just to be still, alone with God. You might be surprised at how such a time can change your perspective on life and mean that you are raring to go again when things start back up in September, perhaps with different priorities.

St Patrick's Church in Bampton are looking for more volunteers to help carry on the Great British tradition of Bell Ringing.

Could this be the perfect activity for you?



Why Learn to Ring? There are many reasons; contribution to church life, companionship, be part of a team and community, pleasure and fun, physical exercise and mental stimulation (burns calories, tones muscles and relieves stress) and probably many other reasons as well. Individuals, couples, sometimes whole families or groups learn to ring together from all walks of life, for all faiths and none (you don't need to be musical, mathematical or strong).

When a ringer has learned how to ring they can visit other ringing towers in the UK - a great activity at university - or any tower with bells (mostly UK) where they will find a warm welcome and immediate friendship. It is never too early or too late to start.

Come along for an initial 'have a go' session. No qualifications necessary. Bell Ringing is fun for young people (10+yrs), adults of all ages and well within the capabilities of most people. Also counts as a DofE 'skill'. If after the initial 'have a go' session you decide bell ringing is for you, teaching sessions can be arranged over several weeks or months (depending on your availability) after which you join the tower band of ringers for Sunday Service ringing, Weekly Band Practice, Civic occasions, Special celebrations, Weddings and so on.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- · Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

PLAY BRASS IN EDEN a project supported by Eden District Council

In the "Brass in Eden" project, Drum and Brass is working with four local bands in Eden: <u>Appleby Town Band</u>, <u>Kirkby Stephen Silver Band</u>, Melody Makers - Tebay and <u>Penrith Town Band</u> as well as music organisations including <u>Bjamba Horns</u> and bands elsewhere in Cumbria to secure the future of brass bands in our community.

With a grant of £8,750.00 from the Eden District Council's Arts and Culture Development Fund the "Play Brass in Eden" team _ Julie Hoggarth, Jenny Bowes and Kath Wignall are touring schools in the area with their hands-on brass taster sessions. In these sessions, young people get to play along with the "band" and find out how they can take up playing.

It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of banding. There are also groups for adult beginners and nearly every band will welcome new players with open arms and a cuppa.

The project organiser Drum and Brass sees brass bands as central to community life. For communities, brass bands mark the seasons with music and are a must-have for e.g. Christmas Carol events and Summer Fetes.

For musicians they represent an affordable and sociable way to learn a musical instrument and they are open to all ages. And despite the many challenges of covid and cuts in music education, bands are thriving. Eden has three established bands, which meet weekly in Penrith, Appleby and Kirby Stephen, while three new brass groups between Tebay and Kirkby Stephen with collectively 30 members show there is real interest in learning.

It was agreed that the bench at Lowergate was in a state of disrepair, and that a notice would be placed to inform residents that it would be removed. Following a change of policy at Westmorland and Furness Council, the Parish Council agreed that all footway lighting previously adopted from Eden District Council would be returned to the Unity authority. The Parish Council would ensure that any agreement would include an obligation to consult the Parish Council if the lights are considered for decommissioning in the future, to enable them to act appropriately.

Work is continuing on an Emergency Plan for the Parish, with stakeholders to be identified and consulted.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 14th July 2025 at 7.30pm at Morland Village Hall.
